The SVU 6-MINUTE CHALLENGE is a series conceived in 2015 by Suzanna Halsey for SVU New York. Czech and Slovak artists, professionals, scholars and scientists are challenged to present their talent, the subject of their work, project, research, or studies in a short presentation limited to six minutes.



Pavel Liška is an immersive multidisciplinary artist from Pilsen who integrates live video performance, light design, scenography, illustration, kinetic objects, and interactivity. After several years as an electrical engineer, Pavel completely changed his field. He earned his B.A. in Comics and Illustration and an M.A. in Animation and Interactive Media from Ladislav Sutnar Faculty of Design and Art in

Pilsen. His characteristic artistic elements include interactivity, movement, and concept. His projects include interactive and educational exhibitions for children, escape games, stage designs, pop-up books, light objects, and murals. Long-term collaborations include exhibits for DEPO2015 in Pilsen and for the National Technical Museum in Plasy, and light objects for the BLIK BLIK light festivals in Pilsen and Vary Září in Karlovy Vary. In 2019 Pavel founded the pop-cultural festival CO.CON in Pilsen. He is currently experimenting with kinetic sculptures and paintings during his residency at Gray Nivas in Accord, NY.

Matěj Číp a pioneering cimbalom performer from the village of Hodslavice near Novy Jicin, discovered his life's calling at age eight. Trained by the Czech Republic's leading cimbalom educators, he garnered first-prize accolades at the 2017 International Cimbalom Festival and a Summa Cum Laude graduation with a minor in Chinese from Northern State University, making history as the first U.S. university-level cimbalom student. In 2021, Číp ventured to China's prestigious Central Conserva-

tory of Music in Beijing. His studies led to groundbreaking performances incorporating the cimbalom with traditional Chinese instruments, earning him a stage at the 2022 Winter Olympics. With a broad musical palette that spans genres from classical and folk to jazz, Matěj believes the cimbalom can potentially attract international audiences. Currently, Matěj is busy playing and studying Live Music Production and Design for the cimbalom at Berklee NYC School in Manhattan.
