


Renáta Kamenárová, PhD, a native of Žilina, Slovakia, is a devoted advocate and results-oriented teacher of Slovak and other Western Slavic languages (Czech, Polish, and Upper Serbian), with over 15 years of experience in university education. Most recently, Renáta was Adjunct Professor and Lecturer of Slovak Language at the University of Bologna in Forlì, Italy (2012-2016) where she developed the Slovak language curriculum for interpreters and

translators. Before that, she was Assistant Professor at the School of Arts of Comenius University in Bratislava (2006-2011). An accomplished author, Renáta was the lead-author of *Krížom-krážom*, a popular fourbook series of Slovak language textbooks for foreigners, and coauthored the distance learning course (*www.e-slovak.sk*) for Comenius University's Centre for Slovak as a Foreign Language.
