Jakub Lajmon, born in Trstená, Slovakia, studied Computer Science and Service & Science Management at Masaryk University in Brno, Czech Republic. He started programming when he was twelve. Still in college, he founded a software studio. In 2014, Jakub was invited to join a project at the MIT in Boston, MA, during which he also attended entrepreneurship courses. Inspired by the US startup scene, he began trying out his business ideas. Last year, he co-launched a booking platform for private helicopters in Switzerland,

which quickly attracted clients from all over the world. His passion for aerospace led him to join the team behind the first Slovak satellite. He wishes to use his experience to help Slovak technology talents succeed in the newly growing industry of CubeSats (miniaturized satellites for space research).

Martin Rybář, a native of Blansko, Czech Republic, is currently a postdoctoral researcher at Columbia University. He received his Ph.D. in physics from Charles University in Prague, followed by his first postdoctoral research position at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. Martin's research is focused on experimental studies of matter under the extreme conditions that are created during particle collisions at ultra-relativistic energies provided by the LHC accelerator at the CERN laboratory near

Geneva. This research seeks to improve our understanding of the universe a microsecond after the Big Bang. Besides his scientific work, Martin shares his excitement about nuclear physics with the public through outreach activities such as the summer school of astronomy in Úpice and public lectures. He is a co-founder of an outreach project called Science-to-Go.

Ján Remšík, born in Žilina, Slovakia, received his Pharm.D. from Comenius University in Bratislava in 2014 and a Ph.D. in Biology from Masaryk University in Brno in 2018. He devoted his research to oncology and showed that not all of cancer cells within the tumor mass are the same – some of them abuse the evolutionarily conserved mechanisms to disseminate into distant body parts and survive even under the pressure of therapy. Jan currently conducts translational research

focused on a particularly bleak complications of cancer — brain and leptomenin — at Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center in the lab of the neuro-oncologist Adrienne Boire. Due to the lack of mechanistic insights, the therapeutic opportunities for patients with brain metastases are very limited. As a pharmacologist, he believes that his ongoing studies will provide a better understanding of brain colonization by cancer cells and design novel, rational, and evidence-based therapies.
